person of lawful age, who, being duly sworn, declare in relation to the aforesaid case as follows:

I am the father of Benjamin Nedow on account of whose death pension is claimed. I know that he was never married before he married Mary Nedow the claimant, whose maiden name commonly called "Hill" was really De Cote. I know also that Benjamin Nedow and Mary his wife, were never divorced, that they lived together from time of their marriage to date of his death and that claimant was not remarried since his death.

My son's real name was the same as mine, viz: Cyprian, but he was always called "Ben" or Benjamin.

I know also that Mary Nedow, the claimant was never married before she married my son Benjamin. The copy of the record of the baptism of Mary, born Oct. 6, 1866, which has been shown and read to me is a [????] record of the baptism of Mary the oldest daughter of my son Cyprian or Benjamin Nedow and his wife Mary, who is the claimant in this case.
